Repeat Courses GPA Calculation

Our intention is to follow the current UC practice, whatever that may be at the time. Currently, if a student earns a "D" or an "F", and earns a "C" or higher in the repeat course, the repeated grade is used in calculating the GPA.

If a student repeats a class in which the original grade of "C" or higher was earned, the repeated grade is **not** used in calculating the GPA.

The following is excerpted from UC Quick Reference for Counselors:

Courses used to satisfy the "a-f" requirements in which the student earns D or F grades must be repeated with grades of C or higher received. In a small number of instances, as described below, the D or F may be cleared through other means than repeating the course. The repeated grades are used in calculating the Scholarship Requirement GPA. Each course in which a grade of D or F has been received may be repeated only once.

If a student repeats a course used to satisfy the "a-f" requirements in which he or she originally earned a grade of C or higher, the repeated grade will not be used in calculating the Scholarship Requirement GPA.
