WHAT WOULD THE CONSEQUENCE BE?

Discuss possible consequences

What other means of correction been used?

HOW WOULD YOU CODE THE CONSEQUENCE?

- **48900 (a)**: Caused, attempted to cause, threatened to cause physical injury to another student
- **48900 (k)**: Disrupted School Activities and/or willfully defied school authority
- **48900 (r)**: Engaged in an act of bullying
- **48900.4**: Harassment, threats or intimidation creating a hostile educational environment

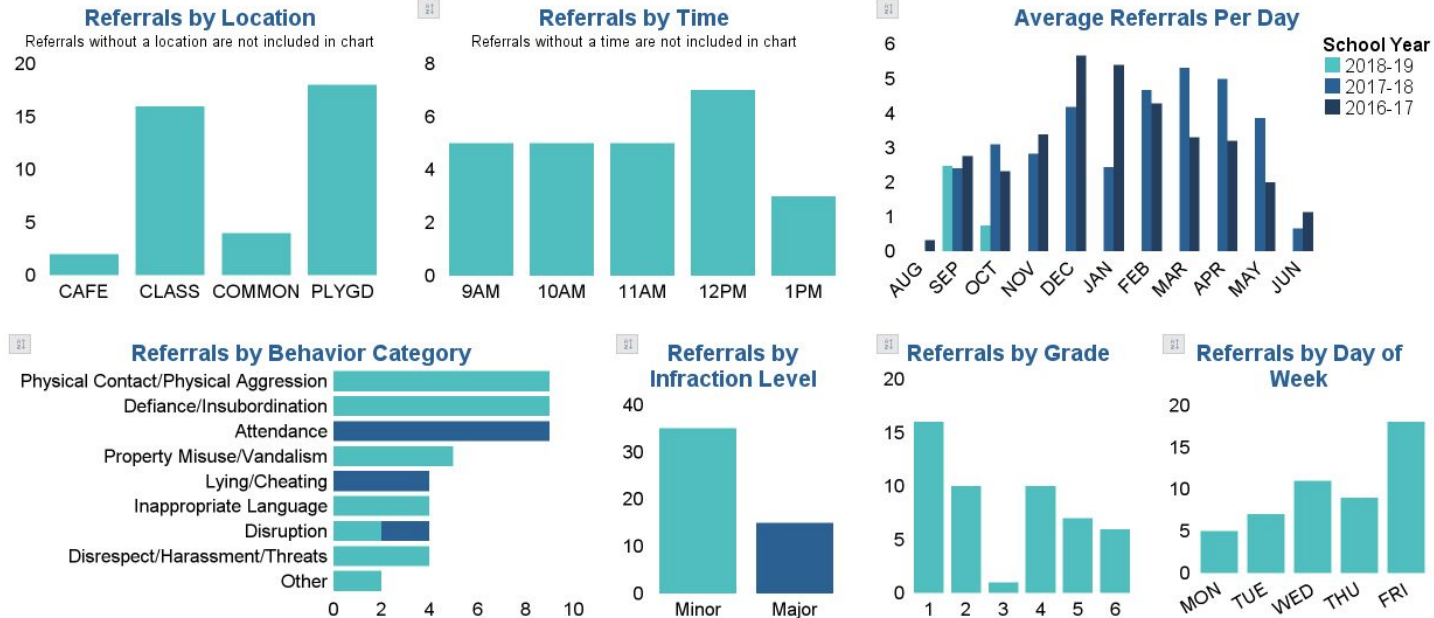

Dear Parent:

The purpose of this letter is to inform you of an incident involving your son/daughter. We found it necessary to suspend your student for violating these Education Code sections:

Ed Code Section	Violation
48900(a)(1)	Caused, attempted to cause, or threatened to cause physical injury to another person.

The incident that caused this suspension happened as follows:

Your child has been suspended for 2 days and makes a total of 2 this year.

The first day of suspension is 10/22/2018. The first day back at school will be 10/24/2018.

If you have not already been contacted or would like to discuss the matter further, please call the school for a parent conference with the Assistant Principal or designee.

In accordance with the California Education Code Section 48900 et. Al.:

1. The student's explanation of the incident was heard and considered before suspension was imposed.
2. The student or parent may request a meeting with the Superintendent or designee regarding the suspension.
3. The parent of a minor (a student under 18 years of age) may have access to the student's records or an 18-year-old student may have access to review his or her own records.
4. State law requires a parent or guardian to respond with out delay to a school official's request for a conference regarding a student's behavior.
5. A student may be required to complete assignments or tests missed at the discretion of the teacher.
6. Reinstatement of the suspended student shall not be contingent upon attendance of the student's parent or guardian at a conference.

During the suspension, the suspended student must not be on or near any school campus during the school day and may not participate in any school-sponsored activities. Supervision of the student is the responsibility of the parent or guardian during the period of suspension.
